#### General information

## SECTION 7: Handling and storage

### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling

#### Advice on safe handling

Prevent the creation of flammable or explosive concentrations of vapour in air and avoid vapour concentration higher than the occupational exposure limits. The product should only be used in areas from which all naked lights and other sources of ignition have been excluded. Operators should wear anti-static footwear and clothing and floors should be of the conducting type. Avoid the inhalation of dust, particulates and spray mist arising from the application of this mixture. Dry sanding, flame cutting and/or welding of the dry paint film may give rise to dust and/or hazardous fumes. Wet [sanding]/[flattening] should be used wherever possible. #### General protective and hygiene measures

## 8.2 Exposure controls

### Appropriate engineering controls

Provide good ventilation. Where reasonably practicable this should be achieved by the use of local exhaust ventilation and good general extraction. If these are not sufficient to maintain concentrations of particulates and solvent vapour below the OEL, suitable respiratory protection must be worn.

### Personal protective equipment

#### Respiratory protection

If workers are exposed to concentrations above the exposure limit they must use appropriate, certified respirators. When operators, whether spraying or not, have to work inside the spray booth, ventilation is unlikely to be sufficient to control particulates and solvent vapour in all cases. In such circumstances they should wear a compressed air-fed respirator during the spraying process and until such time as the particulates and solvent vapour concentration has fallen below the exposure limits. In case of brush application: Filter A2. When applied by spraying: Filter A2P2. (DIN EN 14387)

#### Eye / face protection

Wear safety goggles to protect against splashes. Safety glasses with side protection shield (EN 166)

#### Hand protection

Sufficient protection is given wearing suitable protective gloves checked according to i.e. EN 374, in the event of risk of skin contact with the product. Before use, the protective gloves should be tested in any case for its specific work-station suitability (i.e. mechanical resistance, product compatibility and antistatic properties).
